

## CiCe Summer School Research Methods in Citizenship and Identity 9-14 June 2014

### Rationale for the Summer School

The Summer School is designed to support doctoral students researching citizenship and/or identity, including students who previously attended the CiCe Student Research Conference.

Students, will have the opportunity to present and to discuss their research with other students from a range of disciplines; to plan collaboratively a cross disciplinary research project on issues related to citizenship and/or identity; to explore in depth key research issues with experts in the fields of methodology, ethics and data analysis, and to hear of research conducted by leading international experts.

- keynote and plenary sessions
- research training (methods, ethics, data analysis, ...)
- workshops
- presentations of student research
- peer-to-peer collaboration
- dissemination strategies: presentation, networking, publications.

Proposals are invited on topics related to citizenship and identity. For example, economic crisis, employment, distribution of wealth and social justice, immigration, ethnic relationships, diversity, intercultural issues, social exclusion-inclusion, inter-group relationships, historical culture, sustainability, environmental issues, citizenship education, etc. Papers are welcome from different disciplines including education, psychology, economics, history, sociology, political science, philosophy and anthropology.

## Key information

The Summer School welcomes **fifteen** participants whose papers will be selected for presentation by the Summer School Scientific Committee.

- The **deadline for applications is 13<sup>th</sup> January 2014**. We expect the demand for places to be high and we encourage you to send your proposal as early as possible.
- The Summer School will start on **Monday 9<sup>th</sup> June** at 4pm with an Opening Ceremony and a Keynote presentation, followed by a conference reception. Sessions on other days will start at 9.30am and end at 6pm. The Summer School will finish on **Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> June** at 1pm.
- Participants are expected to be present at all sessions of the Summer School, from the 9<sup>th</sup> to the 14<sup>th</sup> June.
- As part of the Summer School participants will attend the **CiCe Conference**, and present their papers during specific symposia (Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> June). Please see the CiCe website, for further information about the main conference:

- The registration fee for the Summer School is **120 Euro**, which will cover lunches and refreshments (including the Conference dinner). You will be responsible for your travel and accommodation (about 20 Euro for accommodation per night).

## How to make a proposal or book a place

## What to include with your proposal

- 1) A **motivation letter** stating why you want to attend the Summer School and how you think it will support your research.
- 2) **ABSTRACT - 750 words maximum**  
You must submit an *abstract* of no more than 750 words. The abstract is used by the Scientific Committee to decide if your paper is relevant and appropriate for selection for the Summer School. The abstract should describe your proposal, telling your audience what it is about. Please write in full sentences not bullet points.

### What to include in the abstract:

- a **Title** of the paper, the author and the affiliation
- the **research question(s)** of the project
- an **Introduction**: clear statement of the problem that you are addressing, and a short theoretical background. These should then lead onto the declared project aims and objectives
- the **methodology** used: participants of the study (if applicable), the basis of the technique that you are using or the procedure that you have adopted in your study
- a **Results** section (if appropriate): show illustrative examples of the main results of the work
- a **Conclusion** section.

## Once accepted:

Participants are expected to:

- (1) write a paper on their research (**3000 words**)
- (2) create an oral communication with PowerPoint within a symposium
- (3) talk about their research methodology within methodology sessions in student groups in the Summer School.

## BURSARIES

Please note that there are only **THREE** bursaries available to cover half of the summer school Fee, it does not cover travel or accommodation. Bursaries can only be awarded to individuals registered at universities that are part of the CiCe network who are proposing high quality papers. To apply for a bursary you should submit the following documents to the CiCe office after submitting your proposal on line:

### (1) Curriculum Vitae

One page in length, with details of your academic qualifications, previous and current research projects, details of scholarships obtained and held (and the purpose for which they were awarded); details of other seminars and conferences you have attended; details of any published works; other achievements.

### (2) Letter of Application

This should explain why you think you deserve to be given a bursary. This may include reference to your financial circumstances (please note that holders of bursaries will be responsible for their own travel and accommodation costs).

### (3) Letter of Support

This should be made by **your supervisor or another academic referee**, who should indicate their support for your application and set out the academic strengths of your studies and proposed paper.

The Summer School will be held at the University of Warmia and Mazury in Olsztyn, Poland.

### Travel and Accommodation

Olsztyn is easily accessible from Warsaw (Frederic Chopin Airport), Warsaw Modlin (low cost airlines) or Gdansk (Lech Walesa Airport). There are frequent connections to Olsztyn by train (a journey of approx. 3 hours) or bus (approx. 2 hours.) Olsztyn is located at the North-East part of Poland, 200 km from Warsaw or Gdansk. There is also a wide range of ferry lines to Gdansk and Swinoujscie.
