Main Conference

Innovative Practice and Research Trends in Identity, Citizenship and Education

The cohesion of European societies is being fundamentally challenged. Elite definitions of citizenship are narrowing in the face of far right challenges and socio-economic crisis. Formal citizenship education is questioned and under threat in many countries. Nevertheless, young people are responding in new and innovative ways often drawing on new media and technology. How can we as researchers and educators address this context? Do we need to fundamentally change our practices? Are our methodologies still relevant? How do we build citizenship capacity and unleash democratic potential?

With these and other challenges in mind, how children and young people negotiate, learn and act within society and how we prepare and involve professionals in their education is the concern of this conference. We invite proposals from any academic discipline with respect to practice and/or research concerned with identities and citizenship in formal, in-formal and non-formal settings.

Research Student Summer School

Proposals for the Main Conference

Proposals are invited on the conference themes. We welcome proposals for papers, posters, symposia, and workshops.

Papers are either presented as a standard presentation, for which you will have 20 minutes to present and answer questions; or, presented alongside similarly themed papers as part of a **round table discussion**. There is only limited space available for presentations and the Conference Scientific Committee will decide on the presentation format. All papers are eligible for inclusion in the Conference's Selected Papers publication. Papers for publication are selected by the Conference Scientific Committee.

Symposia will group at least three linked papers, presented by a group together. The same rules apply as for papers (4,000 words etc), but you will provide your own chairperson and your time will be limited to one conference session. Therefore, if there are many papers in a symposium then each paper will have less than 20 minutes. Symposium papers are normally presented grouped together in the Selected Papers.

Workshops are interactive sessions lasting 60-90 minutes, in which participants are doing more than answering questions! You will normally need to limit the maximum number of people who might be able to participate. You may wish to provide a written account of your workshop for the Selected Papers publication, in the form of an article of 4,000 words (maximum).

Poster proposals afford an opportunity to mount a standard poster (A1 size), explaining some research, ideas or expressions. You will have opportunity to stand by your poster and discuss it with members of the conference during a timetabled poster session. A paper based on the poster is eligible for publication in the Selected Papers.

How to send your proposal

Proposals MUST be submitted via the proposal link on the CiCe website. We cannot accept proposals that are submitted by any other means:

When making a proposal, we recommend that you read in advance the accompanying *How to make a Proposal Guidance notes* document.

You will need to have all necessary information at hand as you will not be able to save draft forms. We regret that all the information entered on the page will be lost if you move back to the previous page.

Please note the deadline of **13 January 2014** for all proposals to be submitted via the online form on the CiCe website. Regrettably we cannot consider proposals submitted after this date.

Conference General Information

The conference will be held at the University of Warmia and Mazury, Olsztyn, Poland. Olsztyn is easily accessible from Warsaw (Frederic Chopin Airport), Warsaw Modlin (low cost airlines) or Gdansk (Lech Walesa Airport). There are frequent connections to Olsztyn by train (a journey of approx. 3 hours) or bus (approx. 2 hours.) Olsztyn is located at the North-East part of Poland, 200 km from Warsaw or Gdansk. There is also a wide range of the ferry lines to Gdansk and Swinoujscie.
